Be Aware of accidents, spills, home explosions, contaminated water, bubbling in streams, rivers, ponds, illegally withdrawing or dumping fluids - report incidents by completing the PA DEP's online reporting form <http://tinyurl.com/68zluzn> or by contacting EPA Eyes On Drilling: 1-877-919-4372, eyesondrilling@epa.gov. Idling diesel engines and other violations can be reported to the state police. Waterways incidents can also be reported to the Fish and Boat Commission (814) 359-5180.

Keep a Record of when fracking commences, ceases, of flaring, explosions, ground vibrations etc., if you live near drilling.

Monitor your drinking water daily whether well or spring, noting TDS (total dissolved solids) readings, note any spikes and report. If significantly spiked do not drink and get further testing. TDS meters are inexpensive and can be purchased online.

Report your personal experience with a well and dealings with less than forthright landmen to Landman Report Card (<http://www.landmanreportcard.com/>) and WellWatch (<http://scraper.media.mit.edu/wiki/WellWatch>)

Object Pay attention to the notice you receive of the well permit application. You may file an objection with DEP to the proposed location, based on location restrictions described in Section 205 of the Oil and Gas Act. If you file an objection, be prepared to present the facts and reasons for objection to DEP (See the Oil and Gas Act, Section 202, 58 P.S. § 601.202). You have only 2 weeks.
